and two returning Directors. There are 178 campers enrolled in the first session of camp. Staff were able to secure buses to take one field trip per session. This year Day Camp is splitting into two groups to go to different places instead of all at once. Staff are trying this to allow the older campers to enjoy more trips geared towards their age group.

Cooking Camps are all running (Early Childhood, Youth, Teen, and Adult) which makes Arrowhead Community Center full of many unique smells.

This summer there are two new early childhood classes Let's Play! and Fun, Sun & Lunch. Fun, Sun & Lunch is offered for children entering Kindergarten & 1st grade. This camp is utilizing our nearby parks and businesses' such as Arroyo Trails and Cherry Bob.

Summer Dance classes start the week of June 19. Eight classes are running this summer. At the end of the session participants will participate in a Summer Showcase on August 19.

Wiffleball Mania started on June 2 and runs every Friday from 4:30-5:30pm. There are ten participants in the first session. The second session will start on July 7.

Tennis Private lessons have been filling up this summer. Participants can register for 30-, 40-, or 60-minute sessions.

The Summer Co-Ed Youth Volleyball league started on June 13 for grades 3rd-8th grade. The league runs every Tuesday until July 25. There are currently forty-seven enrolled in this league. Volleyball Camp ran from June 5-8 with twenty-eight enrolled. During the week participants over the fundamentals of volleyball as well as played games.

Into to Lacrosse Camp is running two sessions this summer. The first session started on June 14 and will run until July5. This camp will focus on the fundamentals of Lacrosse and the rules of the game. There are currently twenty-five participants enrolled in the first session.

Country Line Dance class started June 15 with eleven registered, but with walk in participants had twenty for the first class! We expect this class to continue to grow over the summer and into the fall. The first Movie in the Park was on Thursday, June 15 at Henneberry Park featuring "Little Giants". There were over 120 participants that came out to watch the movie. The next Movie in the Park will be June 29 at Community Park featuring the original "Jumanji".

Recreation and Marketing Staff are working on collecting information for the Fall Brochure. Staff met to discuss new program ideas.


